



MINNESOTA BOYS HIGH SCHOOL VOLLEYBALL: SPRING 2022

History: The MN Boys High School Volleyball Association was established in 2018. With the support of Hugh McCutcheon, Walt Weaver, and North Country Region, MN Boys HSVB Association had its inaugural Boys High School Volleyball Season in Spring 2018.

2018:	22 Schools	38 JV/Varsity Teams	400+ Boys
2019:	50 Schools	94 JV/Varsity Teams	800+ Boys
2020:	57 Schools	105 JV/Varsity Teams (Covid Cancelled Year)	1400+ Boys
2021:	41 Schools	74 JV/Varsity Teams (Covid Limited Year)	700+ Boys

The 2021 season had 57 schools with 105 JV/Varsity Teams and 1400+ boys registered even with online only schooling due to the COVID-19 pandemic. MN Boys HSVB Assn held a complete season with 7 Conference Titles, Individual All-Conference Awards, and a second successful State Tournament with Andover continuing as reigning Champion and Eden Prairie as Runner-Up.

Mission: Support and create opportunities for boys to play volleyball in Minnesota High Schools.

CHECKLIST FOR STARTING A TEAM IN 2022

1. Find a Team Director/Coach
2. Talk to Your Athletic Director
3. Become a School Recognized Club - If not a School-Recognized Club, then Identify an Entity to "Host" the Club
4. Determine Individual Team Cost & Player Dues
5. Host an Info Mtg, Open Gym Dates & Recruit 12-15 Boys (minimum)
6. Register with Mn Boys HSVB Assn (League) and JVA (Insurance) - See Coaches Corner on our website for checklist www.mnboyshighschoolvolleyball.com
7. Find Gym Space, Set Practices, and Order Jerseys

WHAT'S ALREADY DONE!

The MN Boys High School Volleyball Association eases start-up by streamlining processes and reducing affordability barriers.

Here's what's already set up:

- **MN Boys High School Volleyball Website:** League Standings, Individual Team Website/Communication Capabilities, Coaches Corner with Checklists and Resource Center
- **League Schedule and Officiating:** Regular Play Schedules and Officials Assigned for Each School
- **Team Budget Template:** Use the Line Item Template to figure out YOUR school's needs and estimate YOUR player fee / club team dues
- **Memberships & Insurance:** Affordable Insurance, Registration, APS Training, & Background Checks through JVA
- **Successful Seasons:** There were 22 schools and 39 JV and/or Varsity teams with OVER 400 boys in 2018. There were 50 schools and 94 JV and/or Varsity teams with OVER 800 boys in 2019. The FIRST EVER Boys Volleyball State High School Tournament was held in Shakopee where Andover was crowned Champion and St. Paul Harding was Runner-Up. There were 57 schools with 105 JV and/or Varsity teams (OVER 1400 boys) committed to playing in 2020 before it was cancelled due to the pandemic. The League planned for 7 conferences including one in Northern MN and one in Southern MN. There were 41 schools with 74 JV and/or Varsity teams (OVER 700 boys) playing in 2021 even with online only school due to pandemic conditions. The League held a second state tournament with 16 teams representing every conference. Andover reigned Champion with Eden Prairie as Runner-Up.

Aug – January	Find a Team Director and/or coach	Could be the same person or 2 different people
	BECOME A SCHOOL BOARD APPROVED CLUB!	Create a School Board Approved Boys Volleyball Club. There can be cost breaks and gym prioritization by being a school board approved club as opposed to an association club, but either will work.
	Talk to Your AD/Superintendent/ Principal or School Board	
Sept - February	If School Board approved Club isn't an option, talk to Community Ed, or Park & Rec Department as an Entity to Host the Club	This may be the school activities office, an existing Association, a Booster Club, or even a new entity (New entities will need to apply for social club status (SS-4 form) for Taxpayer ID to open a bank account.)
	Host an Info Mtg	Set Up Fall/Winter Open Gym Dates, Etc.
	Consider Fundraising Options	Start Team Go Fund Me Site, Etc., What local organizations could sponsor the team...eg Alumni Association, Lions Club, etc.
October 10 6:30PM	MN Boys HSVB Assn 2022 SEASON INFO ZOOM Mtg	SCHOOLS WHO HAVE AT LEAST ONE REPRESENTATIVE ON THE CALL RECEIVE \$100 OFF LEAGUE REGISTRATION.

FAQ'S

1. Who do I contact if I am interested in starting a team?

A: Contact MN Boys HSVB who can answer questions.

2. How do I convince my administration to allow boys volleyball?

A: First – talk to the athletic administration about starting a boys volleyball program. Explain all the things that are already in place with insurance, scheduling, background checks, and officials to let them know it will not be more work for them and little to no cost for the school.

Get permission for a team and become a School Approved Club, if possible. Find out when you can use gym space and existing PE or girls volleyball equipment. MN Boys HSVB can assist with supportive information or speaking with your AD directly, if needed.

3. What advantage is there to being a School Approved Club?

A: Many schools offer “perks” such as prioritized gym use and reduced fees for gym time to its clubs that have been formally approved by the School. Ask your Activities Department how it works in your school.

4. What is the Team League Fee? What does it cover?

A: The Team League Fee is the cost to run the league. It covers the following:

- Cost of R1 Officials and associated Admin Fees
- Administrative costs to run the league
- Website Platform - SportsEngine
- SportsEngine Page for Every Team
- SportsEngine Scheduling Module
- SportsEngine League Scores & Team Communication
- Team Registration Fee

5. What is the Player Cost and what does it cover?

A: Individual Player Dues are typically used to cover the expense of uniforms, tournament entry fees, coaches, equipment, etc. EVERY program is different. This is not the league fee. Use the sample budget found in the [Coaches Corner](#) to figure out team cost and divide it by the number of players to find your Player Cost. (A team of 12 players would split the overall Cost 12 ways.)

6. How long and when is the boy's volleyball season?

A: Boys' Volleyball is a spring sport. Pre-Season practice begins early April with the first competition in late April and state tournament event in mid-June. You determine your own practice schedule, however, we recommend starting no later than April 11th.

7. How many games and practices will there be?

A: 10-12 Competition Dates (2 of 3 set match for JV and 3 of 5 set match for Varsity teams per date), 1-4 Practices/Week (You set your own number of practices), & Optional Tournaments

8. How do I schedule matches once I have permission to have a team?

A: Contact MN Boys HSVB to let us know you are committed, pay the team registration fee, let us know when your school can host competitions and dates your team is available to play, then we schedule competitions accordingly.

9. How many schools participated and are there conferences?

A: There were 57 schools with 105 JV and/or Varsity teams (OVER 1400 boys) committed to playing in 2020. The League planned for 7 conferences including one in Northern MN and one in Southern MN.

There were 41 schools with 74 JV and/or Varsity teams (OVER 700 boys) playing in 2021. The League held a second state tournament with 16 teams representing every conference.
